#### Mr. J. O. Larson Was Killed While About His Duties In Cali-fornia Home

G. N. Larson of Lincoln township, received a message recently inform-ing him of the accidental death of his brother, J. O. Larson, while engaged at work on his farm, in the San Joaquin Valley, California, about forty miles from Fresno. He and his son were working about the farm and he was on a wagon unloading posts, and when he attempted to throw one off which had a nail in it, the nail caught in his clothing, and he was thrown from the wagon in such a manner as to break his neck. He articulat-ed only a word or two before he died. The deceased grew to manhood in Lincoln township, in this county, and went to Kansas about forty years ago. He remained there twenty years, go-ing to California where he had resid-ed the past two decades. He was 65 years of age and is survived by his wife and a family of seven grown children. He was one of a family of nine children, three only surviving, they being G. N. Larson, of this county; A. H. Larson, who resides in Kansas; and another brother, D. A. Larson, who has resided in Saskatche-wan, Canada for a number of years.
