I. William Webb must have born about 1700, for his son, William Crittenden Webb, was born in 1732, and his son, John C. (C. All Crittenden fair assumption is that wife was a Crittenden), was marrried by 1754.

He was living in Spotsylvania County in 1747, as he witnessed will of Joh Graves (Crozier's Spotsylvania

County Records, page 9) Same record, page 359 last appearance in records Dec. 14, 1780. Sells land to David Sandidge uses mark. He died in 1783 in Orange County, VA (not NC)., where it is recorded Jan. 17, 1783.

In March 1754, Forrest Webb and his brother, John C, were roommates at William and Mary College housing

William and Mary at that time had a Grammar School as in 1760 there was a Rev. William Webb appointed as Master of the Grammer School. But I couldn't find out anything else about Rev. Webb.

William Webb born in Va. (from my family) was taken to Boone Co. Ky in his infancy 1778. If Forrest did indeed go to Ky. prior to 1783. He might have presumed to have been dead by the family. Forrest wife was Caty Smith. Through this line legend is that it was the Capt. John Smith family. William son of Forrest had a son Forrest M. b. 1802 in Boone County, Ky. who died in Kokomo IN. 11-25-1883..
