are held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Kentucky, in the just and full sum of £50 United States' currency, for which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, &c. jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this 11<sup>th</sup> day of *June* 1835

The condition of the above obligation is such, That if there should be no legal cause to obstruct a **MARRIAGE** shortly to be solemnized between the above bound *Martin*

*Leason* and *Fanny Curtrights* for which a license this day issued, then the above obligation to be void, else to remain in full force and virtue in law.
